**Summer Office Hours**

During the summer months, we do adopt a more relaxed pace—most committees take a break from meetings, and the staff uses the time for planning for next year, and taking vacation time according to their contracts. But, many activities continue through the summer, and our Sunday Summer Services are popular and well-attended, and attract newcomers.

To provide administrative support for all that goes on in the summer, the congregation voted at the Annual Congregational Meeting in June to increase the administration budget to include additional summer support. This summer Fran Sharp will continue to do what she has done in summers past (a combination of wrap-up from last year, administrative projects, and planning for next year), and in addition, Donna Scalcione will staff the office at regular times to enable congregants to know when they can call or stop in and reach a staffer in-person.

Donna (or occasionally, Fran) will be in the First Parish office on  
**Mondays and Fridays 9:30-11:30am.**  
This schedule begins Monday, June 30 and runs through Friday, August 15.  
The office will not be staffed on Friday, the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

As always, First Parish phones and email are monitored weekdays. (The minister's/pastoral line is monitored daily.) Your calls and emails to Fran, and all of the staff, will be returned promptly.



**The Fourth of July Grill**

This fun-fund-raiser is a great chance to hang out on our lawn, chat with friends and neighbors, and have some great food! The grill opens at 11:00am, and stays open through the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade. Bring family and friends, and bring your appetite.

We still need some volunteers. If you are able to help, during Grill-time, or during the prep sessions on July 3, and the morning of the 4<sup>th</sup>, please contact Ted Jones as soon as possible.

July 3: Food preparation (chop onions & Peppers, prepare cups of watermelon, make turkey burger patties, put meats on trays in the refrigerator at First Parish.

July 4: 9:30 - 11 AM: Setup of grill and tables, trash cans, etc.

July 4: Two shifts - Early team 11:30 - 1:15 PM, Late team 1:15 PM - 3 PM: Take in money at the money table, cook, wrap or hand out food at the grill, work in kitchen or carry food from kitchen to grill.

July 4, 3 PM: Take down tables and grill and clean up

We also need more ice chest coolers - probably 4 more than we have right now. We may be using backyard propane BBQs, and if so may need more propane tanks in case we run out.

***Do YOU Put Your Faith Into Action?***

There are lots of ways of doing that. One of them is our vibrant First Parish Faith In Action (FIA) team that annually supports many other groups that put our faith into action. A few of these enjoy wide congregational support, e.g. the annual backpack drive for Sandra's Lodge student residents, the Undecorate the Christmas Tree in support of Framingham Youth Services clients and our sale of free trade coffee. But FIA, perhaps too quietly, provides support and volunteers to many other area needs. Did you even know that we help serve lunch in Framingham on a regular basis at a "soup kitchen?" We also have multiple prison ministries serving inmates at Norfolk, Concord and Shirley. We financially support First Parish's quilters as they create quilts for Renewal House children and soon for those in hospice. You can read more in your Annual Report.

We do all this **meeting only once a quarter** to organize activities, review grant proposals and make decisions on our monthly Share the Plate program. This spring long time members Beth Rust and Ginny Doxsey have completed their terms on the team; both are continuing to support specific activities. Another long time member, Carol Jerry, is moving to NH. We are in need of new members, so that we can remain the vibrant Faith In Action group, and not risk reverting to that old moniker of only having "social concerns," but not the wherewithal to act. **Five Tips for Drying:**

1. Hang your clothes to dry either on a clothesline or a clothes tree, at least some of the time. In the winter, this is a natural humidifier in a dry room.
2. Reduce ironing time by taking clothes out when they are slightly damp and hanging them up, or right away when the clothes are dry. If you get to the dryer too late, you can put a damp towel inside and run the dryer for a few minutes to get the same effect.
3. Empty the lint trap after each use of the dryer.
4. Dry light and heavy clothing separately for maximum efficiency.
5. To make room for drying clothes, buy an expandable shower curtain rod and put it in the shower. Hang clothes on hangers.
