In a perfect world, no child, no teen, no elder, no one living with disabilities, and no one in a committed relationship would live in fear of being abused by persons close to him or her. Unfortunately, we do not live in a perfect world. Abuse happens, even in the kinds of upscale suburban communities where many of us live. A bully might target a child at school or on the Internet. An elderly neighbor may be the victim of family or caretaker neglect or abuse. A friend may be enduring unreasonable social isolation and economic control, emotional abuse, threats of injury or actual physical violence from his or her spouse or partner. Anyone suffering from neglect or abuse (and those who love them) should seek help from our minister, the Rev. Katie Lee Crane. NEW ADDITION**NECK LOOP FOR ASSISTIVE LISTENING SYSTEM**

For use only with hearing aids equipped with a "T" coil.



This deceptively simple looking loop acts as a remote connection to hearing aids equipped with a "T" coil. Listeners plug the neck loop into one of our FM wireless receivers, slip the loop around their neck, and the "T" coil in their hearing aid picks up the sound and amplifies the transmitted sound into their ear using hearing aid. (Ours is new and looks a little different.)

If you have a hearing aid with a "T" coil, the neck loop will usually work better than headphones and the neck loop does not physically interfere with your hearing aid.

The new Neck Loop is kept on the right side of the Assistive Listening System storage/carrying case, with the headphones. Since the neck loop is fragile it is to be kept in a bubble pack bag.
